NWEC Project Update

The North West Enterprise Champions project is a partnership between NCEE and 9 universities in the North West of England – Lancaster University, Manchester Metropolitan University, University of Salford, University of Chester, University of Central Lancashire, University of Bolton, Liverpool John Moores University, the University of Liverpool and Edge Hill University.
